#### Aim of the business forum

The Regional Business Forum invites representatives from business, politics and civil society to take part in a joint time capsule and look at the economies of the Western Balkans from the perspective of 2030. Where does the region stand in 2030 in terms of economic, political and social development? What conditions had to be met to achieve the results of 2030? What framework conditions had to be implemented? What should have been done differently? What did not work? Which lessons learnt can be provided?

Participants will be asked to discuss different topics in a panel of three, combining business, civil society and politics. The audience will have the opportunity to ask questions and make comments directly and through an online tool.

Each panel will start with a very short impulse of max. 5 minutes to point out the key results /challenges of the topic.

#### **Target group**

Regional and international stakeholders from business, politics and civil society with a focus on the region.

The summary of the main take-aways will be presented on the websites of the German Eastern Business Association and the German-Serbian Chamber of Economy.
